### **SENIOR MASTER SERGEANT BRYAN A. DAVIS**

SMSGT Bryan A. Davis started his Air Force career while in high school. He took 4 years of Jr. R.O.T.C. at Warren G Harding High. Upon graduating high school, he continued with ROTC while attending Kent State University. In April of 1988 SMSGT Davis enlisted in the Air Force Reserves. After completing basic training and interior electrical technical school he was assigned to the 910 CES, Youngstown ARB, OH as an interior electrician. Opportunities in his civilian career lead to several personal moves from 1993 to 2000. During this period SMSGT Davis was an electrical craftsman for the 805 CES and the 442 CES. Because of the demands of his civilian career he went into ARPC in January of 1998. After September 11<sup>th</sup>, 2001 SMSGT Davis came out of ARPC and reenlisted into the active reserves. SMSGT Davis is currently a member of the 301<sup>st</sup> Civil Engineering Squadron, NAS Fort Worth JRB, Texas.



While assigned to the 301 CES; from 2002 through 2006, SMSgt Davis was a volunteer instructor for the Air Force Reserves Training and Certification Center, Dobbins JRB, GA. During this period SMSgt Davis provided war skills training to Reserve, Guard, and Active Duty personnel on the Harvest Falcon Electrical System and the Emergency Airfield Lighting Systems. In 2009 SMSgt Davis deployed with the 506<sup>th</sup> Air Expeditionary Group, Kirkuk Regional Air Base, Iraq. He was assigned to the 506<sup>th</sup> Expeditionary Civil Engineering Squadron. SMSgt Davis was the NCOIC for the Emergency Airfield Lighting System and the NCOIC for four Task Force Safe projects. Upon returning from his deployment in June of 2010 SMSgt Davis was selected as the First Sergeant for the 301<sup>st</sup> Logistics Readiness Squadron, NAS Fort Worth JRB, Texas. In this capacity he was responsible for providing the 301 LRS Commander with a combat ready force of approximately 102 Airmen to support worldwide requirements. In July of 2014 SMSGT Davis returned to the 301<sup>st</sup> Civil Engineering Squadron where he serves as the Facilities Superintendent.
